A Call to Action for Our Elders: Standing Up for Knox County Seniors

"In the end, we will be judged by how we treat the most vulnerable among us."

In every community, there are those who have given much and now ask for very little. They are our veterans, our retired farmers, our widows and caregivers — the quiet backbone of Knox County. And right now, they need your voice.

Across Illinois, local and state governments are facing financial uncertainty. Budgets are tightening. Priorities are shifting. But one thing should never be up for debate: our responsibility to care for our seniors must remain non-negotiable.

At VNA Community Services, we serve hundreds of older adults every month — delivering hot meals, providing health and safety checks, offering transportation, guidance, and connection. For many, we are the only face they see that day. For some, the only call they receive. The work we do doesn't just help — it saves lives. But we cannot do it alone.

POLICY SPOTLIGHT: What the Disbanding of ACL Means for Our Seniors

In a stunning development with far-reaching implications, the Administration for Community Living (ACL) — the federal agency tasked with overseeing the Older Americans Act (OAA) — has been officially disbanded. This move creates immediate uncertainty for the future of senior services across the country, and especially here in Knox County. The ACL has served as the backbone of federal aging policy, coordinating critical funding streams for:

- Home-delivered and congregate meals
- Family caregiver support
- Elder rights protection
- Health and wellness programs

With the ACL now dissolved, the oversight, accountability, and unified vision behind these essential services are at risk of fragmentation or delay.

As Knox County considers future funding decisions and resource allocation, we urge every resident to speak out. Call or email your local city council member. Reach out to your county board representative. Let them know that supporting seniors isn't a luxury — it's a duty.

✓ What You Can Do Right Now:

- Contact your city or county representative and tell them: "I want to make sure Knox County seniors are always supported even in times of uncertainty."
- Share your story if VNA or another local program has helped a loved one in your life, make it known.
- Encourage your neighbors to act. A community that stands together is a community that's heard.

We're not asking for special treatment — we're asking for basic dignity. For compassion. For recognition of a generation that paved the way for everything we enjoy today.

Their needs are modest. Their contributions were great. Let's make sure our community shows up for them.

Because when we take care of our seniors, we affirm the kind of community we are — and the kind we want to become.

Stand up. Speak out. Let's protect Knox County's greatest generation.

For agencies like VNA Community Services — and for the thousands of seniors we support — this could mean serious disruptions in funding, guidance, and program continuity.

Now more than ever, local and state leaders must step up. If the federal government can no longer guarantee consistency, we must ensure that our communities fill the gap.

What You Can Do:

- Contact your state and federal legislators and urge them to protect OAA funding during this transition.
- Demand that replacement oversight structures include transparency and experienced aging advocates.
- Stay engaged. Follow updates. Let your voice be heard in support of seniors who cannot afford to be forgotten in a bureaucratic shuffle.

This is not just a policy shift - it's a test of our values.

Let's rise to meet it.

Dementia Friendly Galesburg Kickoff was Resounding Success


